Airport Run Tech Checklist:

All cars running in the North Omaha event will have to pass a safety/tech inspection checklist on the following items:

Wheels/tires/brakes:

Tread depth, proper inflation, cuts or cracks in sidewalls, loose or broken spokes, knock-offs/lugs tight; brake fluid leaks and good brake pedal.

Engine:

Throttle returns to idle, fuel leaks, oil leaks, water leaks, clutch/brake fluid leaks.

Body/Chassis:

Doors latch, bonnet latches, boot lid latches, boot empty, battery tied down, seat belts, loose items in cockpit, muffler, suspension, full windshield or goggles.

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



The Kiss of Death to Frozen Parts

Not too long ago I had to remove the rotten wooden railings from my doors, and the car seat sliders from the wooden floorboards in my MGA. Not too surprisingly, nearly every one of the bolts snapped in half with the first crank. Then a mechanic friend of mine recommended a General Motors spray called "General Purpose Penetrant and Heat Valve Lubricant" (GM part #1052627) which retails for about \$5. He made some claims about the ability of this stuff to loosen up the tightest nuts and bolts. He gave me a few shakes of what was left in his spray can, and low and behold - this stuff is a miracle! I sprayed a few frozen parts and left them overnight; and the next morning they came off just as nice as if they were greased on. I read the can (something I always save for last), and noticed it said "after just a few minutes" they could be taken off quite easily. I doubted it, but tried some other equally frozen nuts and bolts after just three minutes, and it worked equally as well.

This is a must for every household, let alone if you're a car restorer. It's the kiss of death for all frozen parts!

Approximately 50 cars and their owners showed up, one having been driven from as far as Florida. One person trailered his in from the state of Oregon, several Aussies from Australia as well a few true Brits intermingled with us Yanks and we had several owners/drivers from the Hershey area.

Two featured speakers were at the conference: John Sprinzel, a Sprite and British car racer in the 60s and 70s, author of "The Spritely Years" and Daniel Stapleton, a superb mechanic and technical book writer from Across The Pond.

Events included a simple funkhana in the hotel parking lot, a three-hour rally through the hills of Pennsylvania, an autocross, breakfast and dinner drives to a variety of Lancaster County restaurants and a dress-up dinner with awards and an auction.

(I ended up as auctioneer, with hastily-whispered instructions to Barbara about what to bid on and how high to go.)

I had the chance to attend several tech tip workshops and chat with lots of other Sprite owners about their cars. For example, Peter Caldwell's session on rebuilding shocks. Pete's refurbishing shop is in Madison, Wisconsin and those of us going to the Elkheart Lake Vintage Races in July plan to stop and get an eyeful on our way there.

It was also a chance to renew old friendships with folks such as Tony Bennetto who owns a garage in Melbourne called The Bugeye Barn.

Tony was the only one there that said "more beer" with a word that sounds like hire only beginning with the letter "b". And music teacher friend Steve Bell (see the May issue of "Healey Marque") whose Ford truck broke down, but not his Sprite.

Yes, it rained everyday, going and coming, and while we were there. How did we do in the events? There were two race-prepared Sprites in the autocross that ran about 1:03 while I was running 1:24. But I wasn't last.

We missed 3 out of 58 items and were less than 1 minute off in time and DID NOT place in the top six. Real good rallying. However, our Sprite was selected as the Best Modified Sprite at the meet.

No question -- if you get the chance to go in 2008, take it!



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

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
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The *Flatwater News* is published for members like:
