Test your driving skills while winding through a serpentine course of orange construction cones and never leave 2nd gear. It is a very exciting event that lasts around 60 seconds per run. We usually have enough time to give everyone 3-4 runs. This is a timed event so you can lay down a base line and try to improve on your performance with each run.

Course setup and car safety inspections start at 9-10 A. M. The runs begin when we are set up and ready and continue into the afternoon. Volunteers man this event so when you are not driving you will be cone spotting or helping in some way.

If you are new and or have never done this event, we will give you an orientation, ride alongs and assistance. Helmets are required so bring one and some loaners will be available if you don't have one.

Vehicle operation and safety inspections are required and conducted. Key items include: Good tires, seatbelts, batteries fastened down, brakes that stop the vehicle in a straight line and accelerators that don't bind.


triumph trans-ameriCa charity drive 2009

Fumes -The La Junta Race Report

Having been snowed out of Hallett in March – 8" of the white stuff with temps in the 30's was just too much for me and the Sprite to handle – I was "Jonesin" pretty bad for some track time by mid-April when the La Junta race came around. La Junta is not my favorite track – it's basically part of the old La Junta airport (think Scribner with derelict buildings and desert instead of cornfields). It's 1.6 miles long with 7 turns at an elevation of 4238 feet. Elevation change is zero, it is after all part of an airport, but at least it's a racetrack.

I got to La Junta on Thursday, April 16, got my annual tech inspection done at the track that afternoon, and then settled into my motel room to get ready for "Test and Tune" on Friday. Unfortunately, the weather didn't look very promising. That was the weekend of the blizzard that hit Denver and points west, but at least in La Junta it was rain and not snow! (Note to self for next year – Spring apparently doesn't arrive in Colorado until sometime <u>after May 1.</u>) Anyway, I got up Friday morning and since it wasn't actually raining at the time went ahead and drove to the track. Of course once I got there it did start to rain fairly heavily so the track schedule got delayed a bit.

The La Junta race weekend is also the weekend of the annual RMVR Driver's School and there were 20 students enrolled. Vintage British cars included two MGBs and a TR3. There were also several Porsches (new and old), a Lotus Elise, several Formula Vees and Super Vees, and a Honda Civic. After some initial classroom instruction the students did a "follow me" track session with their instructors. It had stopped raining, but since the track was still wet they were told that they could go out in street cars if they wanted to. I wish I had my camera to take a picture of the pickup trucks and SUVs sharing the track with MGBs and Porsches – it was quite a sight!

By 11:00 it was starting to clear and the track was drying out so I decided to venture out to see how the Sprite would run, using my rain tires just in case there was still any standing water on the track. I had the track completely to myself and it felt great to be back behind the wheel again. I was out for about 20 minutes when the car started to blow some smoke, so I pulled into the paddock to see what was going on. After a call to Terry Worick and disconnecting a vent hose I had no more smoke and the car was running well.

The sky was continuing to clear and so after lunch I went out onto the track again, this time with my regular track tires on (Yokohama A032s). I was sharing the track with a red MGB-GT, a Miller Sports Racer, and a couple of Super Vees, but still had much of the track to myself for the 30 minutes or so that I was out. The car ran well but was oversteering a bit and I remembered that I had forgotten to adjust my tire pressures when changing to the Yokohamas. After returning to the paddock I adjusted the pressures and found that the engine was leaking a bit more oil than usual. I decided to venture out once again for more "test and tune." The car was running and cornering well for about 2 laps when it started losing power. I limped around for another lap to make it to the track exit and headed to my spot in the paddock. I was still losing some oil and also being down on power I decided to call it quits for the weekend rather than risk damaging the engine.

It was time to load up and head home. Whatever was wrong, I couldn't diagnose and fix it at the track, even with Terry W's help via cell phone. Oh well, that's life and racing. At least I got in most of a track day to satisfy my "racing Jones" until mid-May and the first race at High Plains, the new track east of Denver. Like Arnold the Governator said, "I'll be back!"

Wet ~N~ Wild Scribner, 2009

It was typical British weather for the Airport Speed Runs at Scribner Air Field this year. The weathermen had this one predicted almost perfectly. We were told that the rain would lighten through the morning and then come back in mid-afternoon. That's exactly what happened. We set up in a light mist, but by the time we were ready to start the actual timed runs the rain had dissipated. We finished the runs about 3:00 pm and by 3:15 we had a full fledged thunderstorm on top of us. I heard John Ulrich say, "God must drive a British car."

The track never quite dried out, so we had to be careful with braking distances and we found smooth applications of turning forces and judicious applications of brake and throttle pedals to be necessary. The wet track leveled the playing field to a great extent. Big V8 engine cars like Rich Brunke's and John Ulrich's MGB-GT V8's usually have a strong advantage on this type of course that rewards cars with the ability to reach high speeds quickly. Add water, and those cars just can't get that big horsepower to the ground.

Highlights of the day include Dennis Stone's wild spin into the grass (nearly into the unplanted cornfield), and Jay Shaw's world record distance on cone relocation. Other highlights would be the near perfect functioning of the laser beam timing system designed and built by Gerry Conant. By my count, 15 cars made 78 "official" timed runs. I didn't count the practice runs, but would guess we added another 30 or more of those. That's a lot of high speed driving! The one lowlight was that Terry Davis and Terry Worrick were never quite able to get the intermittent engine misfire problem solved on the racing Sprite. I'd like to have seen what that little beastie could do on this course.

Best time of the day went to John Ulrich in his MGB at 1.05.03. Following that was Dennis Stone in his Jensen-Healey at 1.05.84. It looks like Joel Brunke clicked off one really quick run in Rich's nasty MGB-GT V8 with a time of 1.05.97. His other runs were all at 1.10.16 or under, not bad for a beginner in a car that could be a handful on a wet track. Good job, Joel! Gerry Conant took 4th and 5th place – 4th in Dennis's Jensen at 1.06.13 and 5th with his own TR7 at 1.06.65. Gerry was just fast enough to knock your humble author out of the top 5, having a best run of only 1.96.75 in Dennis's Jensen. (Thanks for the ride, Dennis!)

We had a lot of fun and managed to stay somewhat warm and somewhat dry for the entire event. I enjoyed seeing people trying out each other's rides and seeing how the other cars handled in the wet conditions. I think we learned as much as we ever do about how our cars handle at the limits, and that is one of the goals of the event.
