Austin-Healey Club of America National Delegates' Assembly Indianapolis, Indiana November 9 – 11, 2012

When you get right down to it, the AHCA Delegates' Assembly task is to do the business of the National Club in a manner that is reasonable and financially sound, while the delegates from clubs across America try to represent the interests of their local chapters. As always there are axes to be ground and trial balloons to be floated, but I left Indy with a newfound respect for the organization and its leadership. Credit is due President Gary Brierton, Secretary Jo Switzer, VP of cub support Gary Feldman, Treasurer Bev Sealand, and VP of promotion Greg Lauser for "herding cats" in a thoughtful, calm, and respectful manner.

Once you get to the host hotel, you pretty much stay there and work until you finish the year's worth of business some time on Sunday. Friday night is informal meet 'n' greet as people arrive. Saturday night is dinner followed by an auction of items brought by the delegates. The big-ticket item is always the chance to drive the "Parade des Pilotes" lap at the Canadian Grand Prix with a Formula 1 driver sitting "Beauty Queen" style in back of your big Healey. I always take a Flatwater hat. Oh well.

The meeting begins with reports and reports and more reports. Yes, we have money in the treasury. No, we aren't getting any younger, and who will buy and drive Healeys in a world of smart phones and iPads? However, everyone does pay special attention to the Chapter Reports given by each delegate. Being the 26th chapter, I listened to twenty-five reports before in was my turn at bat. I guess I learned what I already knew. Flatwater is healthy, one of the largest and most active clubs in the country, and like about half the other clubs we are "Multi-Marque". Several clubs reported barely a handful of events per year. Many clubs have no "driving skills" events and no club offered its membership monthly breakfast, lunch, pub night, and supper (Fish) options. Throw in our shows, winter banquet, tours, caravans, and miscellaneous activities, and we were the envy of many a delegate. The free BBQ meal at our free car show with no trophies really freaked them out. During the mid morning break, many delegates and some of the officers sought me out to comment on our variety of events, and ask how they could implement something similar with their clubs. Hats off to everyone in Flatwater who pitches in and makes these things happen.

Other Business

President Brierton reported on negotiations to merge the Austin-Healey Club USA with the Austin-Healey Club of America. (That's "Us", by the way) Healey USA is about a third the size of AHCA and has no formal chapters or organized events. They do have a nice magazine.

Delegates felt one strong national club would better serve enthusiasts, and voted unanimously to direct the executive committee to continue efforts to combine the clubs.

Technology hit the AHCA with a bang. We have a new web host, a new site format, hot links, and those funny little boxes you can scan with your smart phone. The site is now "Secure", and will be improved on a constant basis by people who know a lot more about computers than I do.

Insurance is what it's all about. AHCA is moving from a 3 million dollar liability limit to a 4 million dollar policy to better reflect the litigious times in which we live. Insurance Director Fred Dabney stated that he is going to push for 5 million dollars of coverage in the future. Please see additional news on insurance in this issue.

Obviously, there was much more business conducted, but it was mostly procedure, and not newsletter material. I left the hotel on Sunday feeling good about what was accomplished, and (almost) sad this was to be my final term as delegate. Needless to say, the 15 hours it took to get home thanks to over booked, canceled, delayed, faux stand by, gate changed, waiting for crew, flights, gave me plenty of time for reflection on the experience.

Insurance Responsibility and a Cheeseburger

If there was a curve ball thrown at the delegates' meeting it was over membership and insurance. As you know from the main article, Flatwater is one of the largest chapters in the country. What you may not know is we have the lowest percentage of our membership belonging to the AHCA. This in itself is not a problem as far as Flatwater is concerned. I believe our multi marque diversity is one of the strengths of the club. Additionally, AHCA has little relevance for someone who owns n MG, Triumph, Jaguar or any other non- Healey. However, when it comes time to pay the insurance premium for the four million dollar liability policy, the national members' dues are responsible for the entire amount. In real numbers, the AHCA holds back five dollars of national dues for insurance. By rough calculation, there are about nine hundred local members in all the chapters across the USA and Canada not contributing toward the insurance clubs must have to hold events.

Needless to say, there was some spirited discussion at the assembly. One option was to require every member to own an Austin-Healey. That's not as crazy as it sounds when you realize there are some clubs with 100+ members who all own Healeys. Another option was to require AHCA dues from all members. Obviously, I wanted to be sure neither one of these became motions that made it to the floor. With support of President Breirton, VP of Club Support Gary Feldman, and VP of Promotion Greg Lauser, (During a bathroom break), we were able to craft a motion to be made as soon as we returned to the meeting.

In plain words, the motion directs the AHCA to assess local chapters five dollars per local member to match the amount paid by national members through their dues. Additionally, AHCA will now have a list of names and addresses of all members in chapters throughout the USA. Not a bad thing to have when liability is in question. This will go into effect Jan. 15, 2013. The motion was made, seconded, and passed in a blink.

What does it mean for us? Well, if you're a national member, nothing, and if you own a Healey, I strongly encourage you to join the National Club. If you are a local member, the Flatwater officers felt we could cover this coming year's cost out of the treasury. In 2014, Flatwater local members will pay \$20, a \$5 increase to cover the insurance costs. AHCA members will continue to pay \$50 national dues and \$15 local dues since their insurance costs are covered by their national dues. Still a bargain, still the most bang for your buck, and still less than the price of a good cheeseburger.
